Morning Visit to Pima Air & Space Museum

Be amazed at one of the largest aviation and space museums in the world! Featuring over 300 historical aircrafts, from a Wright Flyer to a 787 Dreamliner. Sitting on 80 acres, the museum encompasses six indoor exhibit hangars (three dedicated to WWII) and offers docent-led walking tours and exclusive bus tours of the 2,600-acre "Boneyard", a U.S. military and government aircraft storage facility.

Horseback Riding at **Tanque Verde Ranch** followed by Chef's Table Lunch with Chef Justin Macy Tanque Verde Ranch is one of America's old time cattle and guest ranches, located on 60,000 acres of Tucson's most breathtaking desert landscapes and nestled amongst the Rincon Mountains and adjacent to Saguaro National Park. Established in 1868, Tanque Verde Ranch is recognized as the last luxurious outpost of the old west providing guests with plush accommodations, unparalleled amenities and a vast array of exciting activities including horseback riding, mountain biking, fishing, hiking and more.

Tour of Native Seeds/SEARCH

Since its founding in 1983, Native Seeds/SEARCH has pursued its mission to conserve, distribute and document the adapted and diverse varieties of agricultural seeds and their wild relatives, and tell the stories behind these seeds in the cultures of the American Southwest and northwest Mexico. This treasured Tucson nonprofit organization promotes the use of these ancient crops by gathering, safeguarding, and distributing their seeds to farming and gardening communities.

Bread baking class with master baker, Don Guerra at Barrio Bread

Don Guerra opened bakeries in Flagstaff, AZ and Ashland, OR before returning to Tucson where he taught K-12 students for seven years. Over time, Don yearned to return to the artistry and passion of his baking days and started experimenting with new recipes. A "garage bakery" remodel yielded Barrio Bread in 2009 and the Community Supported Baker was born. Don is committed to working with local farmers, chefs and other food producers to strengthen and grow the local food economy. In 2015 he was awarded a USDA Local Food Promotion Grant that helped him increase collaboration with others and expand production with a new bakery. Today's baking class will highlight his work with heritage grains.

Lunch at Welcome Diner

The Welcome Diner is a southern-tinged, southwestern located, farm to table American fare diner. They scratch cook with the finest local ingredients – made with integrity by their purveyor partners. Welcome Diner is situated in a classic Googie architecture building, designed by California architect Ronald Bergquist, and built for the Sambo's restaurant chain in 1964.

Tasting at Iron Johns Brewing Company

Iron John's Brewing Company is a small-batch, community supported microbrewery that creates craft beers in small, handmade batches. Their brewing system's capacity is two barrels (that's about 60 gallons per batch) and all their beer is bottled by hand. The barley is milled on site and they use only whole grain, hops, spices and yeast in the brewing process. Unique beers are brewed and released on a weekly basis.

Check into the brand-new AC Hotel by Marriott

Savor downtown Tucson's vibrant culture at the AC Hotel by Marriott, where you'll find locally inspired artwork in the lobby and enjoy craft beers and unique spirits sourced from southern Arizona in the AC Lounge. Live like a local while exploring an original Tucson event like the Tucson Gem & Mineral Show, Rodeo Parade, or All Souls Procession. Enjoy a signature AC cocktail by the rooftop pool while watching the iconic Tucson sunset over the Catalina Mountains.

Breakfast at Hotel Congress

This historic hotel located in the heart of downtown Tucson will celebrate its 100th anniversary in 2019. Forty guest rooms retain their timeless appeal with vintage radios and antique iron beds. A fully operational 1930s-era switchboard and the rumble of occasional trains contribute to the ambiance, making for a unique and memorable stay. Enjoy the beautiful lobby, dine in the award-winning Cup Café, pull up a stool in the Tap Room or take in a show at Club Congress.

Walking tour focusing on murals in downtown Tucson

Last year, Tucson received the wonderful addition of eight new murals in the downtown area. This collaborative project between several organizations, funded by various grants and donors, and designed by multiple artists, draws attention to the creative community in Tucson. Blank walls spur the imagination and possibility of what could be, and with these blank walls no longer blank, the hope is that tagging will decrease in these areas. But more than simply deterring such behavior, this program has provided an opportunity for the community to express itself in a fresh, bold way.

Visit to Mission San Xavier del Bac

This Catholic mission built in 1783 and located about 10 miles south of downtown Tucson is generally considered the best example of Spanish Colonial architecture in the United States, but that description only scratches the surface of the beauty and history of this place. The interior and exterior are both breathtaking and the story of the church is a fascinating insight into the history of this region.

Lunch at PY Steakhouse at the Casino Del Sol Resort

One of only five Forbes 4- and 5-star restaurants in Arizona, PY Steakhouse brings a new era of dining to southern Arizona. The finest cuts of meats, fresh seafood and a wine list second to none, coupled with outstanding service in an elegant dining room create an evening unlike any other. The culinary scene starts here.

Tour of Hamilton Distillers, makers of Whiskey del Bac

After years of crafting furniture that was authentic, lasting, and handmade – wood kiln dried in house, furniture assembled with mortise and tenon joints, and finished with hand applied oil and wax – there was never any question or contemplation that Hamilton's whiskeys would be made otherwise. They do everything right in house. They malt their own barley, and they mash, ferment, distill, barrel and bottle under one roof. After learning that so many "craft" or "artisan" American whiskeys actually come from the same mega-distillery in Indiana, they especially are proud to say they do it all themselves.

Tour of Franklin Auto Museum
