Visit the bar of John Kavanagh's which lays claim to being the oldest family pub in Dublin – it was established in 1833 and the current family are the 6th generation in the business. Also known as 'The Gravediggers' because of its location next to Glasnevin cemetery, this is a genuine Victorian bar, and it has a reputation for serving one of the best pints in Dublin. The pub also makes an appearance in James Joyce's Ulysses and on June 16, Bloomsday, many people (some in Edwardian costume) will descend upon The Gravediggers, to mark the burial of the fictional character Paddy Dignam.
